RESTORATION ACTIVITIES IN THE ADELAIDE HILLS Hosted by the Adelaide Hills Motor Restorers Club
Join members of the Adelaide Hills Motor Restorers Club for morning tea at their Clubrooms at Mount Barker in the Adelaide Hills. Then inspect their extensive collection of restored (and unrestored) rural vehicles, machinery and memorabilia. See some rebuilding activity using lathes, drills, mills and so on. From here we will proceed into Hahndorf for a stroll through the historic town and browse through the many galleries, pubs, antique and craft shops and try some of Beerenberg's famous German food. Lunch, if you prefer, is also available at the popular Hahndorf Mill. A half-hour drive will return you to the city via the freeway and the Heysen tunnels with magnificent views of Adelaide along the way.

HORSES TO HORSEPOWER

Hosted by the Military Vehicle Preservation Society

We invite you on a run of approximately 40 kilometres to visit the National Military Vehicle Museum at Edinburgh Park. The 6 acre site with onsite parking is a group of heritage listed buildings built during World War 2 which now house an extensive collection of historic military vehicles dating back to 1916.

More than 80 vehicles with associated equipment are on display spanning 100 years from WW1 to present day including a number of vehicles used at Woomera and Maralinga. Dioramas depict Australians in many different past conflicts and peace keeping missions and there are displays of memorabilia. There is something of interest for everyone.

On arrival tea and coffee will be provided. There will be a guided tour of the Museum followed by a 2 course lunch at the Museums new undercover eating area.

In the afternoon there will be a tour of the Restoration Workshop then the volunteers will demonstrate the capabilities of vehicles on the Museum testing area. For the more adventurous there is the opportunity to ride in the vehicles.
